

SCREENING BEST PRACTICES

SCREENING BEST PRACTICES

1. Contact the film's screenings manager to get started

Contact the film's screening manager at screenings@thehongkongermovie.com to set up a date, time, and location for your event. We recommend this coordinating call with our dedicated member of our film team to walk you through every step of the screenings process.

2. Create an RSVP page for your event

We recommend creating a place for your attendees to RSVP. Our screenings manager can create an Eventbrite for your event, this is a great free tool that can help you track RSVPs.

3. Promote your event on social media

Promote your screening event on social media and invite your friends and network to share your event.

- Create a Facebook event on your organization's Facebook page.
- Write a few tweets and tag your event hosts to help people save the date and learn about your event.
- In all of your social media posts, include a link to the film's website to help your target audience learn more and to watch the trailer.

4. Market your event

Send emails to network: friends, family, and colleagues to spread the word about the film and your screening event. To see email examples for both in-person (page 11) and virtual events (pages 14-15) of this toolkit.

5. Keep in touch with your attendees

Once you've created your marketing materials and start collecting RSVPs, be sure to frequently send reminders about your event, both via email and through social media posts.

6. Do a tech check

We provide a detailed tech checklist later in this toolkit (on pages 6-8) to confirm the sound levels and screen.

7. Complete your day of screening checklist

Reference the “Day Of Checklist” for in-person (pages 9-10) or virtual events (pages 12-13).

8. Take photos

We recommend designating someone to take photos of your event. You can share the photos on social media and pass them along to us as well.

9. Ask use questions before your event

You have a dedicated screenings manager to support your movie event. Let us know if you have questions about the event and keep us in the loop throughout the lead-up to the event. You can email us anytime at screenings@thehongkongermovie.com

10. Host a post-screening panel

We recommend hosting a panel after the film to encourage a robust discussion on the important topics summarized in the film. Make sure everyone invited to the panel has an opportunity to speak.

11. Impact survey

We will send around an impact survey to gather feedback on how the film is received once your event is over.

TECH CHECK



TECH CHECK

Print this list for use during your tech check.

1. Test your movie setup

A day or two before your event play the film to make sure it looks good on your screen. If playing off a laptop, make sure to turn “sleep mode” off so that the laptop does not go to lock screen before your event starts.



2. Check the start of the film

Make sure the film begins with soft music and a swinging birdcage (pictured on the left).



3. Check The Hong Konger title

You will see the title of the film at time code 2:25. It should appear in the middle of the screen. Check to make sure the top and bottom are not cut off.



4. Left-hand side screen check

At time code 3:10, the name James Cunningham appears with his title below. Check to make sure you can see his full name and title on the screen.



5. Right-hand side screen check

Go to timecode 7:28 and check that Mark Simon's name and title are not cut off on the right-hand side of the screen.


6. Music and sound effects check

Music kicks in and sound effects of Tiananmen Square begin loudly at 16:13. Test to make sure the sound level high at this point.



7. Speaker sound level check

At 50:40 test the sound level of this speaker. Make sure you can hear him say "It would be quite hard for me to go back to Hong Kong."



9. Test call to action

At 1:09:30 make sure that you can see the call to action on the screen.



10. Watch the credits

The movie with credits is one hour and 13 minutes. The credits start playing at timecode 1:09:40.

DAY OF SCREENING CHECKLIST

IN-PERSON EVENTS

Print this checklist for use during your event.

- ☐ **Get to the event early and locate your screening room.**
 - If your screening room is difficult to find, hang flyers to direct people when they arrive at the venue.
- ☐ **Confirm that there is a microphone available for the Q&A and/or post-film discussion, if needed.**
 - If possible, do a mic check before people arrive and find volunteers to walk the microphone around the room during the discussion to capture any audience questions.
- ☐ **Encourage your audience to post on social media at the event.**
 - Ask them to post on Facebook, Twitter or Instagram about the film with the hashtag #FreeJimmyLai.
 - Make sure to encourage them to tag @ActonInstitute on Facebook, @ActonInstitute on Twitter, or @acton_institute on Instagram.
- ☐ **Designate someone to take photos of the event.**
 - Share any photos or videos of your event on social media.
 - Make sure to send your event photos to the film team at screenings@thehongkongermovie.com
- ☐ **Set up a registration table by the entrance to check people in.**
 - Direct them to where the screening room is and know where the bathrooms are (that is a popular question you might be asked).
- ☐ **Introduce and thank partners before the film.**
 - Do this as briefly as possible, to keep energy up before the film.
- ☐ **Let attendees know they can host their own screening.**

WEEK OF SCREENING CHECKLIST

VIRTUAL EVENTS

Print this checklist for use during the week of your virtual event.

- ☐ **Make sure the online platform you are using will be able to adequately play the film.**
 - Test the sound of the movie beforehand on the online platform.
- ☐ **Create an agenda document.**
 - Create an agenda document that goes over a schedule of the event.
 - Make sure all panelists have access to this schedule in advance.
 - Do a practice run of the show to make sure your panelists are comfortable with the online platform, specifically that their video and audio work.
- ☐ **Post on social media about your virtual event.**
 - In the lead up to the event, make sure the event is promoted on social media at least a week in advance, with a reminder going out the day of the event.
 - Post on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram about your virtual event with the hashtag #FreeJimmyLai.
 - Make sure to tag @ActonInstitute on Facebook, @ActonInstitute on Twitter, or @acton_institute on Instagram.
- ☐ **Communicate with your audience before the event.**
 - Set up emails to go out 24 hours prior to the event, 1 hour before, and as the event goes live to remind people to join online.
 - See pages 14 and 15 for example email copy.
- ☐ **Introduce and thank partners before the film.**
 - Do this as briefly as possible, to keep energy up before the film.
- ☐ **Let attendees know they can host their own screening.**

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Who is Jimmy Lai?

Jimmy was born in 1948 into a rich family in China whose wealth was stripped. Eventually, he went to Hong Kong for a better future, where everything seemed to be possible. At the request of a friend, he read *The Road to Serfdom*, which changed his life. Eventually, Jimmy opened multiple businesses, from manufacturing to retail, and became a billionaire. After the Tiananmen Square massacre, Jimmy became a supporter of the Hong Kong liberation movement. This led him to creating Next media and the famous pro-democracy newspaper *Apple Daily*, which consistently advocated for a free Hong Kong. The CCP later arrested Jimmy in December 2020 and charged him under the National Security Law and denied him bail. Jimmy is still imprisoned to this date, as he awaits trial under the National Security Law. Everything he has is due to Hong Kong and freedom.

Have Hong Kong and China always had strained relations? When did the tension arise?

In modern history, they have had strained relations. The boiling-over point was Tiananmen Square in 1989.

What is the historical precedent of cases such as this?

One can examine this case and see ties to the American Revolution. The early United States and Britain shared a “one state, two systems” method until the American Revolution, which established two new states.

How can I support Mr. Lai's release?

100,000 people asking questions overnight can make this case bigger.

- Talk to your elected officials.
- Use #FreeJimmyLai and #FreeHongKong on social media.
- Advocate for freedom, religion, individual liberty, and entrepreneurship for the marginalized, and victims of government oppression.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

How is his case relevant? Why should I care?

This case highlights the CCP stifling free speech, infringing on the sovereignty of its citizens or neighbors, and their anti-market bias. Jimmy is the epitome of mankind's struggle to obtain individual liberty, freedom of religion, freedom of speech, and overall freedom against tyranny. They have crushed a part of their own country for attempting to enrich their lives. That is what many areas of the world experience daily, and why the Acton Institute is working hard to ensure individual liberty sustained by religious principles.

What is the history of Hong Kong?

Hong Kong is a region in southeast China. After the Opium Wars, it was acquired in perpetuity by China. However, in 1898, Hong Kong New Territories were acquired by Britain on a 99-year lease. During this time, Hong Kong was a mecca of capitalism and economic prosperity, as the city evolved into a great metropolis. Eventually, pro-democracy protests inspired by Hong Kong's success began in China. These protests led to the deplorable massacre of Tiananmen Square in 1989, where the Chinese government opened fire on protesters. When Britain returned Hong Kong to China after the expiration of the 99-year lease in 1997, the system of "One Country, Two Systems" was the agreed upon terms. Essentially, Hong Kong would remain in autonomy for 50 years. China, however, immediately showed that they had no intention on keeping those promises. In 2003, China proposed Article 23, which prohibited any act of treason, sedition, secession, or subversion against the Chinese government, which was met by massive protests and eventually withdrawn. Eleven years later, the Chinese government introduced the Hong Kong Electoral Reform Bill, which walked back voting rights given to Hong Kongers by the British. Essentially, Hong Kongers could vote, but only from a list of candidates approved by the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). In 2019, Hong Kong saw the proposed Extradition Law, which would allow for the CCP to arrest Hong Kongers and imprison them—in China. Subsequently, the CCP withdrew this bill also. But, in June 2020, the Chinese government approved the National Security Law. As of 2022, Hong Kong has 25 years of autonomy left before being handed back to China.
